

Farmington, NM Culture and Topography

The area that is **Farmington** now was settled by the Anasazi in the 7th Century. Ruins can be visited at nearby **Ruins** and Salmon in Aztec Ruins.[7] When **Anasazi** the left the area. the Navajos, Jicarilla Apaches, and Utes moved into the area.

Horseback riding, hiking, bicycling and birding are all available via the many trails that run through Animas and Berg Parks. The Animas River is also great for rafting and canoeing.

Windsurfing on Morgan Lake is a good time year-round (the water stays at around 75 degrees), but spring is when things get really fun, as the winds that kick up on the lake will have you zooming around like you've got an onboard engine.

Fly fishing along the Quality Waters of the San Juan offers River a chance to catch big and release trout. The fly fishing in Farmington brings enthusiasts from the all over country.

The dry and temperate climate allows for year-round fishing, hiking, biking, and four-wheeling. The snow-capped San Juan mountains to the north, and the famous fractured

volcanic breccia bursting out of the ground known as Shiprock, first called Tsé Bit?a?í,whcih means "winged rock" in Navajo, to the west, create the perfect vista for exploring Farmington's many natural splendors. From canyons and mesas to the unusual hoodoo formations (tall, thin spires of rock that looks like gigantic drip castles), this city of roughly 44,000 people is becoming a mecca for thrill seekers and outdoor lovers alike. This coming June, the **Four Corners Xterra Triathlon is** being here in Farmington.








The elevation of Farmington is 5,453'. The climate is hot, dry, some winds with a 55 humidity.



















(A Suggestion)

The Best Trailer Pulling Route To Farmington, NM from Region 6 Area...

The easiest pull for your trailer or motorhome for the drive to Farmington from our area is to travel I-20 W to the Tyler, TX exit, (Hwy 69). From here on you are on 4 lane roads which take you through the hill country of west Texas where you will see the big ranches, horses, and some neat small towns. (You also miss having to drive through Dallas and its traffic!!!).

Head northwest on Hwy 69 to just past the small town of Bells, TX. Here you will turn onto Hwy 82 West. (Hwy's 69 and 82 also have 4 lanes). This parallels I-20, and is just south of Texas-Oklahoma line.

You will eventually come to town of Henrietta, TX. Just past it you will turn North on Hwy 287 to just north of Wichita Falls, where you will merge with I-40. Stay on I-40 all the way to Albuquerque.

When you get to I-25, turn north for 16 miles, turning left onto Hwy 550. This is the old Apache Highway and goes thru the reservation with the great things to see.

You will continue and come into Bloomfield, NM and hit Hwy 64 W. Turn left and in 12 miles you will be in Farmington and the International WBCCI Rally site.

This is the route we take to get to Colorado where we have been going out almost yearly since 1961 to camp in the San Juan Mountains. No high mountain passes to contend with.

Safety Tips for the Trip to Farmington

- 1. Check your trailer and tires over thoroughly! Repair and Replace if needed.
- 2. Roads can be bumpy, so tighten up and be sure that your storage and cabinet door locks are tight. Don't forget the refrigerator door!
- 3. Check you air condition in both your car and camper. It can be over 100° going and coming. <u>Take AND drink plenty of water to stay hydrated.</u>
- 4. Take Jackets and hats as the weather in the mountains can drop quickly and you snow is sometimes possible. Especially in the high mountain passes of Colorado. It may be hot during the day, but can get really cold at night out there.
- 5. Be sure you keep you gas tanks filled as in places stations are far apart.
- 6. Take a well stocked first aid kit with you and be sure your medical information is always with you for emergencies. Be sure you have your medicines with you!.

 Have numbers for you doctors and family readily available. Just in case.
- 7. Travel or caravan with others if possible. There is safety in numbers.
- 8. Take extra of everything... tools, meds, food, blankets, etc. You never know!
- 9. Take plenty of pictures, cords for your phone, computer, etc.
- 10. Enjoy the scenery, make memories, stop and explore, and Have Fun!!!
